



**Kindergarten Enrollment for 2025-2026 is NOW OPEN!**

To enroll a new student, complete the **Enrollment Intake Form**.

Enrollment in kindergarten for the 2025-2026 school year, a student must turn 5 years old on or before September 1, 2025. On March 17, all District 203 elementary schools will hold **Kindergarten Preview**. At this special event, you and your child will meet the school's administrators, the kindergarten teachers, other school personnel, and representatives of parent organizations. While your child remains in the classroom and enjoys a sample of the kindergarten experience, school personnel will meet with you and other parents to share information about the kindergarten program. Due to the nature of this meeting, we respectfully ask that you make childcare arrangements for your younger children during this event.

**Important Dates:**

- February 1: Kindergarten enrollment begins
- February 3: Dual Language Information Night at Naperville North High School from 6-7 p.m.
- March 17: Kindergarten Preview. Please contact your school directly for specific information.
- March 21: For participation in the Dual Language Lottery your student's Kindergarten enrollment must be completed by Friday, March 21st. Enrollment must be **COMPLETE** to be considered for the Dual Language lottery. Complete means that you have turned in all the paperwork and received an enrollment confirmation.
- April 11: Dual Language Lottery results will be emailed.

## Eligibility for Bus Transportation



- The District provides bussing for all families who live 1.5 miles or more from their home school.
- In some special circumstances, families who cross streets designated as hazardous are also provided bussing.



## What would my child experience in Spanish Dual Language?

The philosophy of the Naperville School District Dual Language Program is to educate our students to become bilingual, bi-literate, and multicultural in this ever increasing global society.

*In addition to the components of the all day model, Dual Language students will experience:*

- Literacy and content (Math, Science, Social Studies) learning in two languages throughout the whole day using the same curriculum as the general education classes. (In Kindergarten, 80% of instruction is conducted in Spanish with built-in language support for students who are learning Spanish as an additional language.)
- Opportunities to learn about the cultures of the Spanish and English-speaking worlds.

## How can I enroll my child in Dual Language?



**Available at our school or in the magnet program:**

- Enroll your child in Kindergarten by **Friday, March 21, 2025** to be entered in the lottery
- Mark that you want your child to be considered for the Dual Language program on the enrollment form
- Lottery results will be emailed on April 11, 2025
- Younger siblings of current Dual Language students are given priority enrollment (**they must be fully enrolled by March 21, 2025 as well** )
- Classroom Makeup: Approximately 50% students who speak English or other languages at home and 50% students who speak Spanish at home

## How to Prepare for a Smooth Transition

- Build confidence
- Build independence
- Build stamina
- Taking risks
- Promote self-regulation skills

### KINDERGARTEN LIFE SKILLS CHECKLIST

#### BATHROOM SKILLS

- Flush the toilet
- Use a urinal without pulling your pants all the way down
- Wipe yourself
- Shutting and locking a bathroom stall door
- Undo clothing

#### EATING LUNCH

- Open a milk carton
- Open string cheeses
- Open every item in their lunchbox independently
- Clean up at the end of lunch
- What to throw away vs what to keep (disposable vs. reusable)
- Know if they brought a lunchbox that day
- How to put their lunchbox in their backpack
- Know what their lunchbox looks like

#### CLOTHING

- Zip, button, snap, tie
- Put on a jacket
- Fasten their belt
- Tie shoes
- Understand that they must keep their clothes on at school

#### FAMILY INFO

- Their first and last name
- Their parents first and last name
- Caretakers phone number

#### CLASSROOM 101

- Sit in a chair
- How to follow a 2-step direction
- Sit quietly and listen to a story
- Keep hands to themselves
- How to do NON-PREFERRED tasks
- Pack their backpack independently
- Positional words
- Blow their nose

#### MOTOR SKILLS

- hold a pencil
- use crayons
- hold scissors
- roll play dough

#### SOCIAL SKILLS

- Respectfully answer an adult
- Respond when their name is called
- How to wait their turn
- How to gracefully lose
- Be kind to one another

### Math


- Count and recognize numbers

## Kindergarten Lunch



At lunch, kindergarteners...

- Have a 40 min. lunch/recess period
- May bring lunch or purchase lunch
- Will eat in the MPR with support from staff
- Accommodations are made for students with food allergies

Helping your student prepare for eating lunch at school:

- Students should be able to eat within the allotted time.
- Students should be independent in eating and managing containers. (Staff will provide support in opening containers as needed.)

Breakfast is also provided for those who opt for that meal.

- Information about menus and purchasing school meals will come via email.

## Getting to and from school



### **Bussing - Enter the back of the building**

- Provided for families who live 1.5 miles or more from their home school
- Bus stop locations & Information available on Infinite Campus as of Aug 13

### **Day Care Transportation - Enter the back of the building**

- Provided by various businesses

### **Walking or Carpool Drop Off - Enter the front of the building**

- Students can be designated as walkers and must be escorted to and from school by an adult
- Students can also be driven to school and dropped off in the front of the building

## Arrival Procedures

### AM Carpool

- Parent remains in the car - we have staff to assist in the carpool lane
- Your child should sit behind the passenger for easy access to exit the car
- No cell phone use in the carpool lane

### Day 1 & 2 of school

- All Kindergarten students meet in the MPR
- Teachers will meet students in the MPR and walk them to the classroom
- Ensure your child knows their teacher's name

### Arrival after day 2

- Students enter the building after 8:00 AM either in the front of the building (carpool & walkers) or the back of the building (bus riders)

### Late arrival - After 8:15 AM

- Must be signed in by an adult in the main office

## Kindergarten Red Tote

### Why?

- Safety-identify k-students
- Packing and unpacking ease
- Used for winter gear
- Can be personalized



## Dismissal Procedures

- Dismissal time for Kindergarten and 1st grade students is at 2:25 PM
- Kindergarten teachers and other staff will escort students either to the buses, Champions after school care or the front for carpool and parent pickup for walkers
- Teachers will provide tags for student bags to indicate their method of transportation
- All changes in transportation must be made in writing (email or note) or via phone call to the office no later than 2:00 PM

### **Carpool Pickup - Front of the building**

- Have your child's name displayed in your front windshield to assist with locating students
- Pull as far forward as you possibly can. We will bring your child to you :)

## Welcome from the Health Office



### Certified School Nurse

Holds professional educator license endorsed in school nursing in Illinois

- *Promotes the physical, mental, emotional and social well being of students by providing comprehensive school health services.*

### Health Technician

CPR and first aid certified

- Works under the direction of the School Nurse; provides first aid treatment, including emergency care.

# Health Requirements: Physical Exam

- All physical exam and immunization requirements should be fulfilled prior to the first day of school.
- Exam must be performed within 1 year prior to the first day of school.
- May be completed by licensed physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant.
- Health history portion must be completed and signed by parent for physical to be valid.

The form includes sections for:
 

- HEALTH HISTORY: Questions about symptoms like cough, cold, sore throat, and allergies.
- PHYSICAL EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS: A checklist for various body systems (Eyes, Ears, Nose, Throat, Heart, Lungs, Abdomen, etc.) with checkboxes for 'Normal', 'Abnormal', and 'Not Examined'.
- IMMUNIZATIONS: A table for recording immunization dates and types.
- SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: A section for additional notes or conditions.

# Health Requirements: Immunizations

- Immunizations must be up-to-date and verified by a healthcare practitioner

The form includes:
 

- Header: 'State of Illinois Certificate of Child Health Examination'.
- Child Information: Fields for Name, Sex, Birth Date, Birth State, and School Grade Level.
- IMMUNIZATIONS: A grid with columns for different vaccines (MM, MMR, Tdap, Polio, Hib, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis A, Pertussis, Meningococcal, Varicella, Tetanus) and rows for different ages (12-23 months, 2-4 years, 5-9 years, 10-14 years, 15-19 years, 20-24 years, 25-29 years, 30-34 years, 35-39 years, 40-44 years, 45-49 years, 50-54 years, 55-59 years, 60-64 years, 65-69 years, 70-74 years, 75-79 years, 80-84 years, 85-89 years, 90-94 years, 95-99 years).
- COMMENTS: A section for additional notes.
- PROVIDER INFORMATION: Fields for Name, Title, and Signature.
- ALTERNATIVE PROSE OR COMMENTS: A section for alternative procedures.
- VERIFICATION: A section for verification by a certified hearing technician.



## Health Requirements: Vision Exam



- The vision requirement should be fulfilled prior to the first day of school.
- Exam must be performed within 1 year prior to the first day of school
- To be completed by an licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist.



## Health Requirements: Dental Exam



- Required by **May 14, 2026**
- May be performed any time within the 18-month period prior to the due date (**November 15, 2024-May 15, 2026**).

## Procedure for Ill Students

- Attendance
- Fever: A temperature of 100.3°F is considered a fever
- Undiagnosed Rashes
- Head Injuries
- Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)
- Medication
- Emergency Contacts



## Students must be **HEALTHY** to be **EDUCATED** and **EDUCATED** to be **HEALTHY**
